NYU Shanghai is China's first Sino-US research university and the third degree-granting campus of the NYU Global Network. We were founded in 2012 by New York University and East China Normal University with the support of the city of Shanghai and the district of Pudong. Students explore a liberal arts curriculum before <u>declaring a major</u> during their second year. They'll also spend at least one semester studying away at one of NYU's other two campuses or at one of NYU's global academic centers before returning to NYU Shanghai. English is the language of instruction and upon graduation, students earn two degrees: an American university degree from NYU, and a Chinese university degree from NYU Shanghai.

As students at NYU Shanghai, they live and learn with a diverse student body of approximately 1,600 students from over 70 countries, and they'll be immersed in the local culture on a daily basis. All Chinese language levels are welcome and part of the first-year experience includes practicing Mandarin with their Chinese roommate as they work towards proficiency, exploring the region, and volunteering in the local community. They'll also have access to internships in a city that is home to exciting start-ups and some of the world's most influential and successful organizations. NYU Shanghai's new campus, located along the southern edge of the up-and-coming Qiantan subdistrict, is set to be completed in summer 2022 and will roughly double the amount of classroom space available at NYU Shanghai's current campus on Century Avenue. Plans include a 5,000-square-meter library, roughly 7,000 square meters of lab and research space, and new athletic space. Below are renderings of the new campus.
