



CULTR-CLTA Conference Grant

The CLTA is thrilled to announce the first-time attendee Conference Grant for its **2023 annual conference** and invites applications from eligible members. This award is generously sponsored by **the Center for Urban Language Teaching and Research (CULTR) at Georgia State University**. CULTR continues to support teacher professional development by providing new teachers access to regional and national conference attendance through grants. It will provide an annual award amount of \$900 to support three first-time CLTA conference attendees (i.e., \$300 per award) who are in year 1-5 of teaching. This award is open to all K-12 and college-level teachers who are CLTA members. One award is reserved for K-12 teachers.

The application deadline for funding to attend 2023 CLTA conference is **March 20th, 2023**. Awardees will be selected by lottery at the CLTA's all-member meeting on Saturday evening, **April 1st, 2023**. Please note that applicants who are not present at the all-member meeting will be considered to have withdrawn from the competition. After the conference:

- Awardees are required to complete a brief survey/form which includes their name, number of years teaching, school name and location (city & state), teaching environment (rural, urban, suburban), and a description of the conference presentation, if applicable (however, presenting at the conference is not required).
- Awardees also need to provide CULTR with a short video that can be featured in a CULTR post-conference newsletter and/or on the website. Awardees are requested to visit [CULTR's Conference Grants website](#) and follow the listed specifications for these videos.
